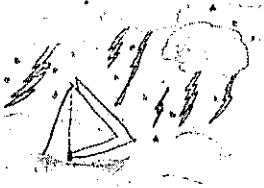

Dixon re-elected to Edenton council

EDENTON — Councilman Sambo Dixon won a resounding victory Tuesday in his bid to retain his 2nd Ward town council seat in Edenton.

Dixon finished with 168 votes to challenger George Grother's 69. That gave Dixon 71 percent of the vote and Grother 29 percent.

"I am just delighted," Dixon, an attorney and Edenton native, said shortly after hearing the un-

official final results. "I'm looking forward to representing the 2nd Ward again and carrying Edenton into the future."

The 2nd Ward council seat was the only contested race in Edenton on Tuesday. Three other town officials won re-election after running unopposed.

Mayor Roland Vaughan was re-elected with 335 votes, Councilman-At-Large Steve Biggs was re-elected with 334 votes, and 1st Ward Councilman Jimmy Stallings was re-elected with 96

votes. Dixon said his goal for the upcoming term was "to continue Edenton's present course to be the best small town possible."

Grother, a retired contractor who moved to the town about a decade and a half ago, thanked all of those who had supported him.

"I'm sorry for the lady who

drove four hours after getting off a plane in Washington, D.C., to vote for me today," Grother said. "I'm sorry I disappointed her."

A total of 395 ballots were cast in Edenton's municipal election on Tuesday. Because the town has 3,142 registered voters, voter turnout for the election was 12.6 percent.

Town elections were also held in Hertford and Winfall on Tuesday. Results were not immediately available Tuesday night at presstime.
